<p>Renewal Criteria</p>	<p>All surgeons must maintain at least 100 cases over 24 months and submit case logs (see Appendix 2) annually to the Chief of Bariatric Surgery. Each bariatric surgeon who successfully performs 500 bariatric cases at Stanford will always be considered a bariatric surgeon in good standing from a volume standard.</p>

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Bariatric Surgery - Must be successfully proctored in the OR by the Chief of Bariatric Surgery for 3 cases with a total of 10 cases to be submitted in writing adhering to the Appendix 2 format. Until proctoring is complete, privileges are temporary.
